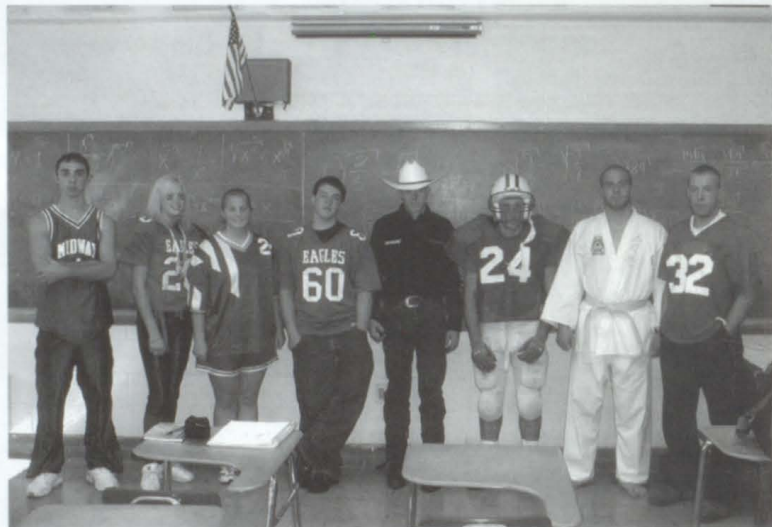

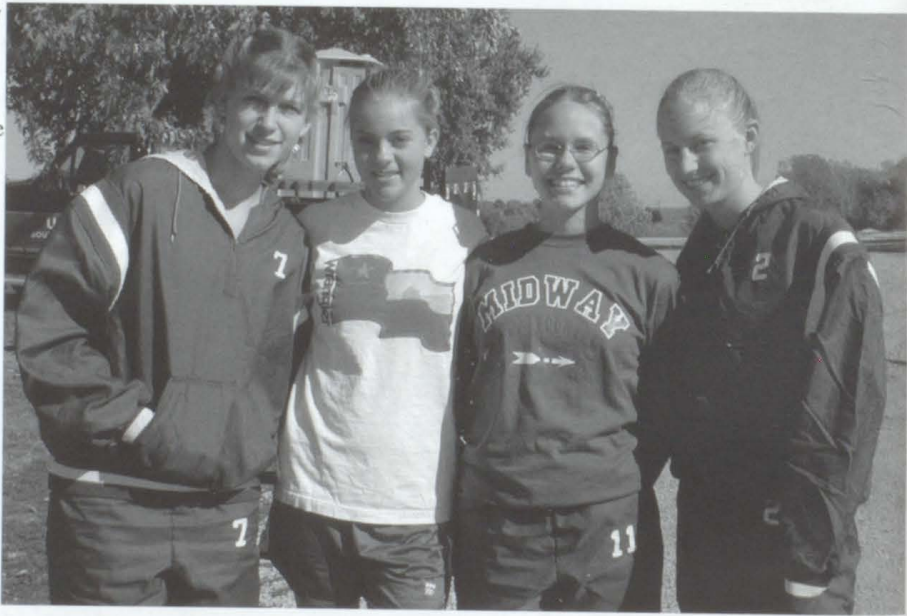
# I take the dirt road

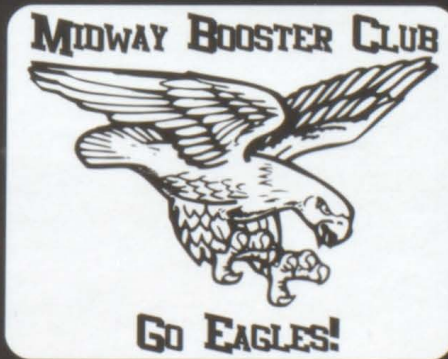
